Since opening in 1929 as the Kentucky Pants Factory, closing in 1987 and reopening in the Fall of 2001 as this community's repository for local history containing archived newspapers, manuscripts, photos, and artifacts that are used for research and exhibits that exquisitely depict what life was like in the Barrens from Native American culture through the 1960's; and

A host of people from this community have generously given funds and volunteer hours since 1988 to create, maintain, and support the advancement of the museum; and

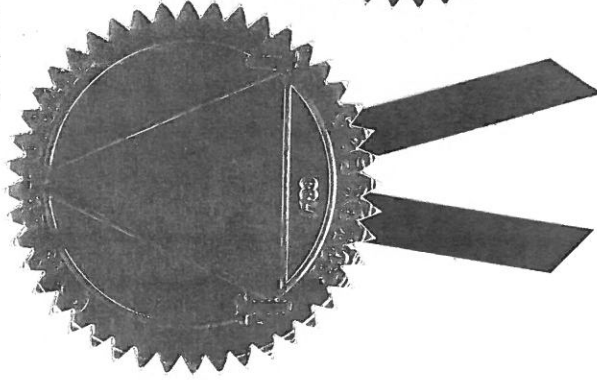
Whereas:

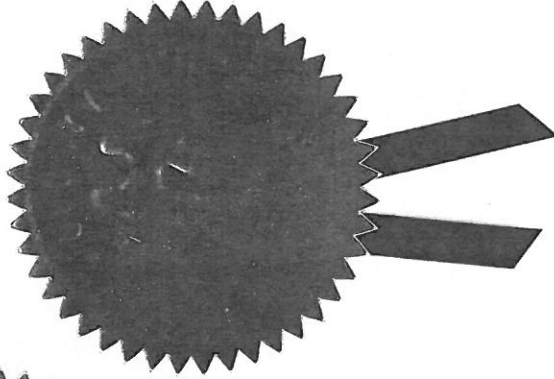
Now, Therefore, We the Public Officials of the City of Glasgow - County of Barren, in the State of Kentucky, do hereby proclaim April 2018 as
