

# Proclamation

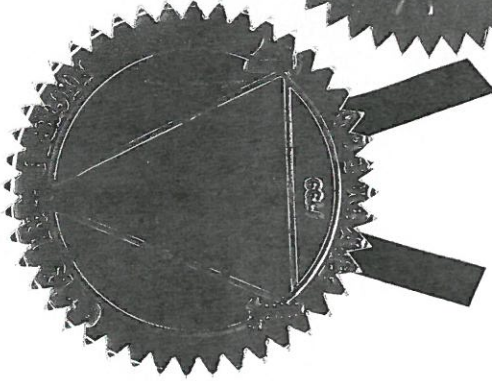


- Whereas:** emergencies can occur at any time that require police, fire or emergency medical; and
